Advocacy

Through individual and systems advocacy, we work with individuals, businesses, agencies and municipalities to remove barriers that prevent people with disabilities from freely participating in our communities.

Community Transition

Youth Transition

We assist youth with pre-employment skills, career exploration, self-advocacy, and customized daily living skills needed to become independent adults.

- **STAGES Summer Program**

Participants are young people with disabilities who learn to live and work more independently.

STAGES = “Students in Transition Achieving their Goals Empowered and Self-confident”¹

Nursing Facility Transition

We provide individuals an opportunity to choose community-based living as a viable alternative to nursing facility residency. The program is open to anyone who receives Medicaid.

Independent Living Skills

We support adults with disabilities to maintain or increase their independence to complete daily activities in their home and community.

We offer assistance with any disability-related questions regarding your rights, the law, accessibility, community resources and more.

Peer Support

Other Services

Accessibility Reviews

We review places and spaces for compliance with current ADA standards and offer recommendations for enhanced accessibility.²

Case Management

We help with developing an individual plan of service, linking to services and supports, brokering of service and support providers and coordination with Medicaid or other health care providers. CMH referral or private pay.¹

Community Education

Training is available to groups or businesses interested in learning more about disabilities, accessibility and inclusion.

In-Home Support

We offer one-on-one guidance and assistance with daily living activities in your home or community. CMH referral or private pay.¹
